We worked on 11 different activities, involving 86 volunteers. Highlights include:

Literacy, English and More Ex- Committee Report October – December 2019 Submitted by Debbie Pirkle

Last semester I worked with five Hispanic students during the school day at two different elementary schools in Decatur.

This semester a door opened for me to go to the Excel Center housed on the campus of Austin Junior High School in Decatur.

I am still working with one elementary child on Tuesday morning but have started to work with two ESL Hispanic middle schoolers from Mexico and Guatemala.

I am going on Monday and Wednesday mornings to do one-on-one tutoring.

I learned Wednesday that one of those students had gotten into serious trouble at school.

Our Bible study group is still meeting on Fridays.

Our Chinese student has one more semester at Calhoun College and then plans to transfer to Athens to finish her teaching degree. Fall semester was a very difficult and frustrating one for her, but she managed to make A's and B's in her classes. She shared about some personal issues that she is dealing with concerning her grown step-children and step grandson. I have maintained contact with her grown son who is presently working in Dayton, Ohio and have been able to spend some time with him on three different occasions. My son who is a co-pastor of a church in Cincinnati has also been in touch with him.

One of our Japanese ladies had to put her husband in a nursing home in a dementia unit. This has been very difficult for her and her grown children. Two of her sons live out -of -state (Texas and Georgia) Her daughter is here, but her husband has serious health problems which may take his life soon. This daughter has one daughter who is a student at UAB and wants to be a traveling nurse. Her other daughter is a junior in high school.

One of our ESL ladies from Colombia is unable to attend because of her husband's health...physical and mental. She is also dealing with the possibility of putting him in a similar setting. Presently she is the caregiver in her home with assistance from Hospice.

One of our former ESL students and her family from France are spending one year in Atlanta, Georgia. My husband and I have plans to get together for a weekend with them in March.

Prayers are needed for each of these situations.

It seems like the past several years have been heavy on the MORE side of English and More. Yes, these folks need English, they need help with their problems, but most of all they need Jesus! They have asked me so many questions that I feel so inadequate to try to answer.
